Note: There is no water available for two 50+ mile stretches. Carry as much water as you need plus more if you are not familiar with your water needs in a desert environment. If you do run out of water, flag down an automobile/motor home/park ranger to get water. Most will be carrying jugs of water. Alternatively, cache water at a midway point between Furnace Creek and Scotty's Castle.
